NCL applauds federal funding for maternal health in 2022 appropriations. The National Consumers League applauds the passage of the 2022 omnibus appropriations act. The appropriations bill, signed into law, includes over \$1 billion in federal funding to support critical maternal health provisions needed to address the nation's alarming maternal mortality rates.
